Our second Power Shift Lab will strengthen ICSOs' impact by encouraging a more effective and legitimate power distribution in their governance, specifically by strengthening the voices of the communities they serve.

To make Agenda 2030's promise to "leave no one behind" a reality, this partnership promotes active use of civil society-driven data in the monitoring and implementation of the SDGs. Partners foster participation of marginalised communities in agenda-setting dialogues with local and national decision-makers.

ICSO Narratives Lab

This new feature for 2020 is an ideas lab for senior ICSO directors. Based on our partner JustLabs' proven methodology, participants prototype narrative strategies and comms models

using the positive common values driving ICSO work to engage new audiences.

Global Standard for CSO Accountability

With 12 commitments, the Global Standard for CSO Accountability, hosted by Accountable Now, seeks an inclusive, responsive approach to civil society accountability, by encouraging a continuous two-way dialogue with stakeholders.

ICSOs Uniting Societies

Amid rising populism, ICSOs must review their working methods and regain trust, by collaborating to engage more people, send positive messages and counter attacks on civil actors. Our objective is to strengthen civil society's accountability, resilience and solidarity in times of scrutiny.

Solidarity Playbook

This will collect and present learnings and strategies from ICSOs' and coalition partners' response mechanisms to attacks against organised civil society, to provide civil society actors and partners to better support each other against such threats. It will be launched at the International Civic Forum, a Global Perspectives pre-event.
